

Make your own games

Playing games with friends and family is fun. Making a game to play with them is even more special. Get out your crayons and create your own dominoes, memory cards or puzzle. The instructions make it easy.

DOMINOES

Instructions:

Print the dominoes template.

Color the same picture in the same way so you can match them when playing the game.

If you want to draw your own pictures, make three copies of the blank template to create 21 dominoes. Be sure to draw the same picture in each box like you see on the coloring template.

After you've colored or drawn pictures, cut out the dominoes.

Now, you're ready to share your game as a gift or just play it with friends and family.

How to play (2-4 players)

- · Turn dominoes face down and mix up.
- Each player draws dominoes, looks at them but keeps them secret: 2 players = 7 each, 3 players = 6 each, 4 players = 5 each. Extra dominoes are the draw pile.
- · Player 1 puts a domino face up in the play area (the first domino played cannot be a same-picture domino).
- · Player 2 adds a domino to one end that matches the picture on that end of the played domino.
- If Player 2 doesn't have a domino that matches the picture of one side of the played domino, they draw a domino from the draw pile. If there are no dominoes in the draw pile, they player skips their turn.
- · Play continues until a player has played all their dominoes. They win.

MEMORY

Instructions:

Print the memory template.

Color the pictures on the coloring template.

If you want to draw your own pictures, make two copies of the blank template to create 24 cards. Be sure to draw the same picture on two cards so you have pairs of cards that match.

After you've colored or drawn pictures, cut out the memory cards.

Now, you're ready to share your game as a gift or just play it with friends and family.

How to play (2-4 players)

- · All cards are spread out face down on a table.
- · Taking turns, 2 cards are flipped face up.
- The object is to turn over pairs of matching cards.
- · If a pair is found, the player wins the pair and plays again.
- · If not, cards are turned face down again and play passes to the next player.
- · The player with the most pairs wins the game.

PUZZLE

Instructions:


Print the puzzle template.

Draw a picture on the puzzle template.


After you've drawn a picture, cut out the puzzle pieces.

Now, you're ready to share your puzzle as a gift or just play it with friends and family.




















Memory coloring template
